Position Overview

The Community Outreach Manager will play an integral role in ensuring the success of MCE's Known & Grown program with the general public, retailers, restaurants, wholesalers, farmers, and others in the food production, sale, and distribution network of the St. Louis region and beyond. Known & Grown works to build a resilient, equitable food community by supporting and promoting farmers within 150 miles of St. Louis that use humane, chemical-free practices as well as spreading awareness about why environmentally-responsible farming is important. This work will require travel in the St. Louis region and will include working at events, and in the office or home (as desired).



This is a full-time position that is grant funded through the Missouri Foundation for Health and USDA. The manager reports to the Executive Director.

Responsibilities

- Work alongside staff to further the programmatic efforts of Known and Grown
- Develop plans for expansion of the program including identifying funding sources for the Executive Director, Development Director, and grant writer to pursue
- Work alongside other staff to reach new audiences (general public, buyers of Known and Grown farmers, new farms, etc.)
- Assist the Executive Director in ensuring grant-related goals are being accomplished
- Create and propose plans for expansion of the program over the next 5 years in coordination with the Executive Director and other staff
- Work with Executive Director and Farmer Specialist/Driver to expand the usage of the shared refrigerated trailer to increase sales of local produce, with an emphasis on supporting disadvantaged farmers and underserved communities
- Assist Farmer Specialist with enrolling new farmers into the program
- Facilitate the Farmer Advisory Committee (FAC) meetings: invite members, develop agendas, take meeting minutes, share minutes with committee after meetings - the FAC provides guidance on the direction of the program to other farmers and MCE staff
- Create and maintain relationships with partner organizations, community members, and farmers to help grow the reach of the program
- Coordinate the hosting of the annual farmer and buyer meeting: secure a location, arrange for food and beverages, develop the agenda, invite guest speakers, develop invitation list, coordinate how invitations will be delivered, take meeting minutes, share meeting minutes with attendees and those who could not attend
- Work alongside the Policy Director to provide sustainable agriculture policy ideas for MCE to consider by holding regular meetings (at least monthly) with them
- Attend and participate in MCE staff meetings (held weekly), Known and Grown program meetings (held weekly), and public events (held throughout the year)
- Supervise and lead the Farmer Specialist/Driver and interns
- Other duties as assigned, including assisting other MCE staff with organizational needs
- Prioritize equity in the efforts of the program and organization

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent experience with at least 4 years experience in a relevant field, such as: food and agriculture systems (e.g. farming, food marketing, food sales, food service, food procurement, institutional purchasing, farm-to-school programs, etc.), community outreach, or program planning
- Positive, collaborative experience working with a team of staff, interns, and/or volunteers
- Cultural competence in working with diverse community stakeholders and leaders and ability to recognize different perspectives they may provide
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office and/or Google Apps

Preferred Qualifications

- General food system, environmental, and sustainability knowledge
- Experience working with small-scale farmers and/or food businesses
- Experience engaging with community members and/or small businesses
- Background with program development and expansion
