By imposing restrictive conditions on plant closures, creating exemptions that weaken renewable energy standards, and potentially compromising transparency in financing reviews, this bill could hinder Missouri's efforts to achieve a balanced and resilient energy future. Missouri energy policy should foster innovation, support an equitable transition to renewable energy, and ensure robust oversight mechanisms that benefit all stakeholders, including consumers and the environment.

Missouri needs energy policies that emphasize sustainability, reliability, and fairness without introducing excessive burdens. Our goal should be an energy sector with lasting advantages for all citizens. SBs 4 is not the path forward.
