

VOTE "YES" ON HB 2725, HB 3071, & HB 1969

Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, located in St. Louis and later in St. Charles, MO, played a pivotal role in World War II and the subsequent Cold War by purifying uranium for the world's first atomic weapons. That work produced massive amounts of radioactive waste, much of which now contaminates local waterways, neighborhoods, schools, and parks. Nearby residents report rare cancers, autoimmune diseases, and birth defects. Missouri must act now to help put an end to this public and environmental health crisis.

HB 2725 (Sponsor: Rep. Appelbaum) AND

HB 3071 (Sponsor: Rep. Wellenkamp):

Both measures update contamination disclosure laws to include current tenants and investigative right of entry, and allows renters to terminate a lease without penalty if known contamination is not disclosed. **Tenants deserve to be informed of radioactive contamination to protect their health and safety.**

HB 1969 (Sponsor: Rep. Clemens): Requires a notice of intent to excavate to DNR to check whether the excavation is in a site contaminated with hazardous waste. **The DNR needs to be aware of excavation sites and remediation efforts taking place to prevent disturbance of contaminated soil and water.**
